Tid-Bits from the Chief of Police

The Adair Village Police Department would like to introduce our two new police cadets; Richard Herbert and Sierra Schlundt. Cadet Herbert is a resident of Adair Village and has just graduated from Santiam Christian School. He plans on attending Western Oregon University to obtain a Bachelor’s degree in Law Enforcement. Cadet Schlundt resides in Lebanon and has just graduated from Crescent Valley High School. She plans on attending Portland ITT and obtain a degree in Law Enforcement. Both of these individuals are going to be an asset in assisting the Adair Village Police Department with its mission of providing the best professional service to the citizens and visitors of Adair Village.

The Adair Village Police Department has just received a signed contract with a towing company. This will help in clearing the abandoned vehicles around town allowing for more on-street parking. City Ordinance allows for a vehicle to be parked on the street for no more than 15 days and must move more than one mile.

The Adair Village Police Department has received several calls this last month in regards to skunks. There is nothing that the Police Department or the Oregon Department of Wildlife can do. To help minimize the problem it has been suggested that cat and dog food not be left out and the lids on the garbage cans be kept closed. This is not a complete fix, but will help minimize the number. If anyone finds a private organization (or any organization) that will help deal with this issue, please let the Police Department know so that we can share that with other citizens.

COMMUNITY VISION WORKSHOP A SUCCESS

The first Community Vision workshop on Thursday, June 18 gave a strong start towards planning and designing the Village’s future downtown. Joe Dills, OTAK Engineering, and Lawrence Qamar, an architect and principal with LQ Town Planning, made the presentation and then, lead the discussion with a group of about 25 citizens. Joe had been the lead engineer in 2003 for the original “Village Town Plan Study.” After meeting with a smaller stakeholder group consisting of local businesses, they prepared the presentation that focused on “The Essentials of Main Street Success.” We will have the presentation available on the website shortly. We will present a schedule of the meetings that will follow in the next newsletter. We are looking for a date in early October (one that doesn’t conflict with OSU, SCS, and CVHS football games) for the actual two day design workshop. There will be an information gathering meeting in early September, to receive input from citizens and prepare for the design workshop.
